The simple DIY instructions for implementing Data Link...

1. Print off both sheets of this document.
2. On sheet 1 cut out and apply adhesive as directed.
3. On sheet 2 cut in half down the middle and fill in the form.
4. Follow the instruction in "Has your fridge got the message?"

You will need to provide a suitable container, such as an empty 35mm film container.



JOIN Data Link THE EMERGENCY INFORMATION SCHEME



What is Data Link?

Data Link is a voluntary scheme for anyone living at home, who might be reassured to know that essential information would be readily available to the Emergency Services, should they suffer an accident or sudden illness.

The scheme ensures that vital information is available not only to identify you, but to advise of relevant illnesses, allergies, medication and contact addresses.

How does the scheme work?

Your details are stored in a clearly labelled plastic container, which is kept in your fridge. Two matching labels, known to the Emergency Services and other care agencies are displayed in the outside of your fridge door and the other on the INSIDE (so it is not visible from the outside) of your front door.

What do I have to do?

1. Complete the form overleaf in ball point pen.
2. Fold it lengthways in half and then half again (concertina style). Turn and continue to fold concertina style and place in container. (A maximum of four sheets will fit in container).
3. Label A - stick to container. (In some cases this may already have been done)
Label B - stick to inside of front door at eye level above the lock.
Label C - stick to the outside of the fridge door.
4. Place the container in your fridge IN A DOOR COMPARTMENT where it will be safe and quickly found.
5. If there are several members of your household who suffer from an illness or allergy, you should photocopy the blank form, then complete one form each and place up to four forms on the container. Only use a second container if necessary.
